

#### Did You Know...?

...that finding "just the right words" to get a point across can be more frustrating than trying to cross a busy New York City intersection on foot during rush hour?

Let me tell you a (true) story. Sometime within the past week or two I saw a post "somewhere" (West Virginia, as I recall) on Facebook asking for help to identify square dance clubs near a little town I've never heard of for some WA state dancers who are moving there soon.

I had the bright idea that it might be an interesting "experiment" to see if I could help (even though I have no personal knowledge of the square dance "landscape" in any of the states on that side of the North American continent). The person who originated the post had already plugged the name of the town into the search field on WheresTheDance.com and didn't find what he was looking for.

What followed the post were several comments/suggestions: e.g. "Google it." Someone with local knowledge of the state offered the names of a couple of clubs but indicated they were probably 70 miles from the town our WA State dancers intended to move to. Someone else posted a link to the West Virginia State Federation of Square Dancing. The webpage lists 17 square/round dance clubs in the state, with contact information and the facility address for each club.

Having absolutely zero knowledge of West Virginia geography, I couldn't tell how far a single club was from the town in question. There was no "pin-map" on the federation website showing the major towns in the state, let alone precisely where in the state any of the clubs called home. So...one who has no independent knowledge of the geography has little choice but to enter 17 different addresses, one at a time, into their favorite map application to get an idea of the landscape. Is that do-able???...yes. But this is 2024...so, is it efficient???...I think NOT!

West Virginia is a tiny state. Washington, California, Texas, etc., etc. dwarf W.V. by comparison. Imagine the frustration of an East Coaster with little "local geography" knowledge moving to some small town in one of those states trying to determine if "Sumner" or "Mt. Vernon" is close to "Monroe" or "Olympia"...and what is the closest square dance club to any of those locations.

Today I tried to find the original post mentioned above as "background" for penning this article. I spent a half hour just trying to find it (with no luck)! That's a frustration in itself (for another time).

But I knew the "solution" to this quandary even before I decided to write about it. WheresTheDance.com is the only resource I'm aware of that has a built-in mapping tool that uses the exact location (address) of every listed club to provide "list" or "map" results for up to a 200 mile radius from any specified location. If ALL clubs would take a few minutes to simply post their basic information on WheresTheDance. com, getting a list of square dance clubs within "x" miles of any city, town, village, metropolis, roadside farmers market or the exact address you plan to rest your head on the pillow would take less than one minute!

Good "hunting"...however you choose to do it!

#### HOSTING AN ALZHEIMER'S DANCE

Marty Bahr was diagnosed with young onset Alzheimer's Disease (AD) in 2000 at the age of 50. He succumbed to the disease eight years later, passing away December 30, 2008.

Marty was born and raised in Seattle, Washington and lived much of his life there. His final six years were spent in Chicago, Illinois where he received exceptional clinical treatment for AD from Rush University Medical Center's Alzheimer's Disease Center (RADC).

During his working life, Marty spent his career in the insurance industry. He rose through the ranks to become an executive with a major insurance company. He was forced to leave that position as the AD symptoms began to manifest; as he could no longer perform the duties required. At that point in time (around 1995), an AD diagnosis had not been made—the medical community at large did not yet recognize that AD could occur in a younger age group ("younger" defined as under the age of 65). It would be another five years before Marty would be delivered the diagnosis by University of Washington Alzheimer's Research Disease Center. (ARDC)

As I his brother (Joe) could see his brother starting to decline. I decided I would ask my square dance group, and the square dance community to support me in hosting a dance with all donations going to the UW study of the brain.

I told Marty what my plans were, he was overjoyed. The dances became well attended and Marty asked if I would continue, he would donate his brain to research. Maybe his life would be worth something and he could help others in doing so. I replied Marty you got a deal!

Today with the generocity of square dancers this will be the 15th fund raiser. We are approaching \$100,000.00 supporting the UW study of the brain. Dr. Thomas Grabowski head of the Study group is extremely appreciative.

Remember, this is the process that requires an updated membership list along with a check for \$6 per member sent directly to us, the Membership and Insurance Chair. We will talk more about this in the next issue.

#### **CIRCULATING THOUGHTS**

This month I would like to talk about the neverending problem of clubs getting smaller and classes not being held because there are no students. I know all of you would enjoy having big classes and dances that you had in the eighties and nineties. It is safe to say that is not going to happen but that does not mean you should just quit.

Several years ago, two Mainstream clubs that had been dancing for over 40 years each suddenly had a decline in membership and beginner class size. Both were to the point of folding, but each kept plodding along because they refused to think outside the box about new opportunities. I called for one of those clubs and behind the scenes I began to discuss with my club's president about the possibility of merging with the other club. At first, he was hesitant but as I told him, "You can try this or accept the fact that our club will eventually go away." He presented it to the club as well as talking to the other club's president. Sometimes it is all in the presentation and the result is that both clubs merged, and their respective callers agreed to share the newly formed club. Since they each had a dance night at our hall, we decided to keep both dances with the callers and cuers trading off calling the dances. Today that club has grown exponentially and continues to have a fun time. The most difficult decision about combining the two clubs was the name. We settled on a name that looked nothing like a combination of the previous clubs' names.

So why am I telling you this story? We all need to start thinking about different ways to do things. Is there a possibility that one or two or three clubs in an area could join together? Are joint lessons taught by two or three callers an option? Would it be possible for clubs to put aside their differences and work together to make things better for everyone instead of selfishly saying "I won't give up my club badge."

In Rainier Council they have developed a teaching program that is supported by several different clubs. Their callers have all agreed to teach the same list in a specified order so that classes are available for students four times a week. They also coordinate the scheduling of student level dances, so students can dance to different callers with different club members. At the end of lessons, they have a combined Graduation Dance. Another example of clubs working together is at the Kitsap Square Dance Center in Gorst. They have agreed that each club will teach their lessons using the same list with the same teaching order so they can have student levels dances that all t students can attend. Here in Olympia, we teach joint lessons sponsored by Olympia Area Square Dancers Inc, with four different callers doing the teaching. We have four opportunities to start lessons during the dance year. Could that work in your area? It is time you started thinking about different ways to do things. Somebody must make the first move to make new things happen. Ask people you talk to, to stay open and positive and listen to new ideas. Remind everyone why we love square dancing and why we need to do something different.

Remember "If what you are doing is not working then why do you continue doing it?" You can either look at new and unusual ways to make your clubs successful or continue to play the "he who dies with the most dancers wins game." Which one will you choose?'

**Dangerous Bling** 

It happened again last week. In the middle of a tip, an elastic beaded bracelet broke, scattering beads underfoot. Luckily, no one fell. The beads were quickly gathered, but we didn't know how many there were, so we kept looking for a few minutes to ensure none were left behind.

Consider the jewelry that enhances your dance ensemble. Beaded necklaces, while beautiful, can pose a problem. Imagine the scene- beads scattering across the floor, halting the entire dance. The embarrassment of everyone stopping to hand you a bead or two could leave you blushing for hours. Ensure your beads are strung on a strong, new thread to prevent this. While retro thrift shop finds are fun, their old strings could easily break. Thankfully, re-stringing is a simple task with plenty of instructional videos available.

I lost an earring on the dance floor. It was a large bead on a post setting, but the back had worn out and become loose. It bounced beautifully and landed in the next square. The solution was simple- fresh new earring backs.

Jewelry findings are available in the hobby section, providing everything you need to repair your current collection or create a new piece that perfectly complements your dress. Imagine turning extra buttons from your blouse into matching earrings. And here's a tip- always make three earrings. That way, you'll always have a spare if one gets lost. Use E6000 glue, the same type used to create the stunning costumes in Las Vegas. It's an exciting opportunity to let your creativity shine.


The newest form of bling is Hot Fix Rhinestones and Metallic Nailheads. I order from - ThreadArt.com. They have a nice teaching section. There are many other sites. The tool you need is a Hot Fix Applicator. It looks like a soldering tool with various tips for different bling sizes. The glue is on the back of the bling; no mess.

Find a stone or marble surface to work on. When glue seeped through the cloth, I glued part of my skirt to a wooden cutting board.

Iron-on bling also comes in sheets. Sue's Sparklers is one site. You pull off the backing and iron the bling in place. Read and follow the instructions carefully. Heat, time, and pressure are needed. I have a T-shirt that I put one of these designs on about four years ago. It goes straight into the wash with my other tops. Hasn't yet lost a bling.

Bling comes in a wide variety of sizes, colors, and patterns. They are fun to work with, and you get exactly the effect you want. Dance clothes are the perfect place to bling to your heart's content. Bright, colorful, and happy are the focus. Understated elegance is for the office or the cocktail party. Bling is the answer, and we don't care what the question is.

#### 73<sup>rd</sup> National Square Dance Convention® Parking

We have been getting questions on parking for our convention.

The downtown Milwaukee Convention area is undergoing a major growth spree with multiple developments and corporate offices springing up causing regular parking changes. We are

very much aware of the parking needs for our convention, and we are at the mercy of development and constant growth changes (none of which were going on when we bid the convention).

We are waiting for the pricing and guidelines for the new 400 space parking garage in the Baird Center, location of the 73<sup>rd</sup> National Square Dance Convention<sup>®</sup>. They have not, as of this writing, released their guidelines and pricing with ongoing construction. There are several city or privately owned parking garages around the Baird Center with height restrictions of 7 ft. These garages charge by the hour and do not provide in and out privileges.

There are a couple of open parking lots with no height restrictions at a walking distance of about 5 to 10 minutes. If you have oversize vehicles (over 7 ft. tall) please consider using mass transit to get to our convention site due to the overhead parking restrictions. The Milwaukee County Transit has Park and Ride lots with transit fees being very reasonable and the transit is very dependable and safe. More up to date 2024 information on area mass transit will be provided in the future as routes can and do change.

We have contacted area parking lots and none of them are able to work with us at this time to give us set parking rates. Rest assured, there are parking options very close to our convention site. Please watch for updates on parking locations and pricing as we gather dependable 2024 rate information to be posted on the 73nsdc.com website and the E-Magazine as we get closer to our convention.

Please consider registering at the Hilton Milwaukee City Center and receive \$5.00 daily parking with in & out privileges! (*There is a 7 ft. maximum height restriction.*) We cannot get these parking prices anywhere else in Milwaukee. The Hyatt also has parking, but it is a privately owned garage that will provide a reduced price.
