61st National Square Dance Convention® Long Registration Form

If you registered for the 61st NSDC before March 26, 2011, you filled out a Pre-Registration Form. If you have not done so yet, it is now time to convert to a full registration by filling out the Long Registration Form.

10 REASONS TO FILL OUT YOUR LONG REGISTRATION FORM

1) This will save you time in line. It is important to fill out and return the Long Registration form before the Convention. The National Executive Committee requires everyone to fill out the Long Registration Form before receiving his or her Badge and additional purchases.

2) Mark the Solo box if you want a 61st NSDC Solo ribbon. This will help you identify possible partners on the dance floor.

3) Print your name (nickname) as you want it on your badge. The city and state on your badge is taken from your mailing address.

4) Fill in the Number of Previous National Square Dance Conventions you have attended. This will be on your name badge. This is a great conversational item when you square up. Only you know the number of Conventions you have attended. The National Square Dance Convention database does not pass this information on to the next Convention. Follow the bright Red arrow on the left side of the Long Registration Form and fill in your number of Conventions attended next to your name on the left side of the form.

5) Order your Program Book. Printing of the Program Book will be limited to the number pre-paid. The price is currently \$10 per book; on April 30, 2012, the price goes up to \$15. Easy-to-carry Daily Schedules are included with Program Book. Daily Schedules are NOT available without the Program Book. In the Daily Schedules, the Dancer can easily find information on the Callers scheduled in the numerous Halls, the Round Dance Showcase of Rounds and their teaching schedule, Clogging, Line dancing, Contra workshops, Education activities, and the Exhibitions schedule. So order yours now. Daily Schedules are NOT available without buying the Program Book.

6) Order your Sew & Save Book. A limited number of "Sew Creatively" books and CD are printed. So order yours now.

7) Order your Hotel or RV Bus Pass. You can have door-to-door service by pre-ordering. The RV bus is nonstop between the Spokane County Fair & Expo Center and the Convention Center. The Hotel buses will run to the two West Hotels and to four Valley Hotels. By ordering now, you are ensured that we have enough buses to meet your needs.

8) Submit your Housing choices. Many of the Hotels have SOLD OUT. So fill in several options. Registered dancers can reserve their room online at www.61nsdc.com. Click on the Housing-2012 link. Click on Reservation link. Select date of arrival and departure. Scan the available hotels. Fill in your choices of bed size, number of people sleeping in the room, special requests. You will receive an email that your reservation has been submitted on the Spokane Hotel Reservation System within 24 hours and should receive a confirmation within two weeks from the Hotel.

9) Fill in the Dance Level area on the lower right side of the form. This information is important to schedule the halls and the Callers, Cuers and Prompters for the dancers. We want you to have a great time with your friends.

10) Fill in the Program information for Callers, Cuers, Instructors, Prompters, Exhibitions and Educations. This will ensure that the Registration Committee gives you a special Ribbon. Be sure to fill out the Entertainer Profile: www.61nsdc.com. This will help the Program Committee in scheduling.

For the 2012-2013 club renewals, we are going to do something different this year hopefully to make the renewal process a little easier. Instead of handing out packets at the winter state meeting as we have in the past, which would then be passed on to the councils, and then passed on to the clubs, we are going to email the renewal instructions directly to each council treasurer. Our reasoning is that we realize each council is different in their requirements for renewing their clubs so the instructions we send out are subsequently modified by each council. Therefore, we believe that emailing the renewal request directly to each council treasurer and letting them proceed with their own directions should help eliminate some confusion. We would ask each council to assist clubs that may have difficulty filling out the online form. Councils need to remember, they are also considered a 'club' in the annual club renewal process.

Also remember, these are club renewals under the direction of the councils. We will be mailing out the individual forms, invoices and instructions directly to every club treasurer in March. And the individual renewals for the 2012-2013 dance season that we will be mailing out in March will have the \$1.50 per person increase in insurance premiums. The insurance will now be \$4.50 and state dues are still \$1.50 making a total per person charge of \$6.00. This increase in the insurance premiums is to cover the additional "door to door" insurance expense.

We would like to ask all clubs to notify us, your Membership & Insurance chairmen, when your new club officers are elected each year. This will allow us to keep our database up-to-date with the most current club officer information.

The Ten Commandments of Square Dancing

It's March and Square Dance lessons are winding down or finished for most clubs. Many Callers, Council and Club leaders have yearly discussions about how to help new dancers make a smooth transition to becoming a regular dancer. New dancers are finished with their "training" and ready to join others in the dance community as club members and or even leaders. There are many things new dancers should know to help them in this transition. Ideally, a new dancer's questions should be answered and resolved before they ever finish lessons. Many new dancers finish lessons and still have questions like "Where can I dance now?" "Do I need to join a club?" If they are single and they danced with an "Angel" during lessons, they may wonder about dancing without a partner. Lately, I have had students and new dancers point out behaviors and attitudes of others in our dance community. Some of those individuals pointed out are/ where club leaders or callers/cuers. It got me thinking about the image we are portraying to others about our activity. Are we teaching new dancers about our traditions and heritage? Do they understand the "WHY" of what we do? Do they feel like they are a part of something or do they just see Square Dancing as something to do until "something better" comes along. Any organization with a history has likely developed a set of rules and traditions that define that organization. Many describe it as a "Culture". Square Dancing is no exception. The Square Dance activity survives today with much of the same Culture it's had from the beginning. This Culture defines the activity and differentiates it from other forms of dance. The Ten Commandments of Square Dancing are not rules or commandments per se. They are more a window into the Culture of our activity and give us a frame of reference. This thought provoking set of "Ten Commandments" is taken from a very old American Square Dance magazine. I have found that the philosophy and meaning behind them is the important thing, rather than the literal translation.

A wise man once said that you will get out of life what you put into it. There is no doubt that this applies to Square Dancing too! The following "rules" are meant as good advice, and should be seen as a way of keeping our activity courteous, fun and fulfilling.

- 1. You will Square Dance only for the fun that you will find in it.**
- 2. You shall not be a snob by considering yourself too good to dance**

with any and all by sitting out mixers, or by leaving a square lest you be required to dance with those you deem unworthy of your talents, for the gods of retribution will visit mischief upon you and you will be the one to goof in the square.

3. You shall be exuberant, but shall act your age. Do not offend others by your high flung legs, out flared skirts, or by overzealous endeavors to help others who may hesitate by pulling, grabbing, or pushing upon them or speaking loudly to them.

4. You shall go abroad and dance to other callers so that your opinions expressed as to the merit of this one and that one are based on fact.

5. You shall be conscious of the feelings of those around you, and shall not let the stranger in your midst sit on the side lines nor fail to speak to him or her.

6. You shall bathe diligently, that the sweet aroma of soap and shaving lotion may assail the nostrils of your associates. You shall similarly take care that the words of your mouth are not scented with strong smelling herbs such as garlic, or strong smelling beverages such as beer. Men shall wear long sleeved shirts so that their arms may be more pleasant to grasp.

7. You shall guard carefully the utterances from your lips while dancing, lest you add confusion to your square and cause yourself or others to hear the next call, for there is but one designated caller in the hall.

8. You shall honor your club and give your loyalty, for if you cannot do this, it would be better to separate yourself from it and join yourself to another whose methods, members and caller are more to your liking.

9. You shall not kill your club by bickering and fault finding, or by pointing fingers of blame for errors in dancing or club operation, at any member or fellow dancer, for, in so doing, such a finger may thus be due in your direction.

10. You shall never forget that you were once a beginner and that others helped you to become a good dancer by tolerating your mistakes. You shall always remember that if you are to be able to continue in square dancing for a long time there must always be beginners and new dancers joining your hobby, and they need your patience and assistance.



To Lead or To Follow . . . That is the Question

One of the things I try to teach to my round dancers is how to lead and how to follow successfully. You will notice, of course, that I did not designate a leader and a follower, because I believe that there are times when the man should lead and the woman should lead, BUT never at the same time.

Traditional dancing identifies the man as the leader during a turn about the floor. For many women, this might seem like a hit to the liberation movement, but let me reassure you that there is no chauvinistic aspect to allowing the man to lead, most of the time. The benefit of having a strong lead partner allows the couple to glide across the floor in flawless unison and reduces stumbles to a dormant status. However, it is important to point out that leading is different than pushing.

I teach my dancers to lead with their frames, not their muscles. The sign of a good leader is allowing their partner to follow. When pushing, the leader accomplishes nothing but nudging their partner off balance. By leading with a strong frame, the partner can follow at a respectable pace with grace. As the following partner, be sure to allow your partner the opportunity to lead. While you can anticipate the dance steps, allow your partner to make the first move. This might seem like it would ruin your synchronization, but it actually allows you to work better together as a couple on the dance floor. This is how a partner can be a great follower.

Most of the time, this lead role will fall to the male partner of the dancing couple. However, do not be fooled ladies, as there are times when it is necessary to come forward and be the dominant leader in the pair. We have all had times dancing when a cue is given and our minds cannot possibly comprehend the dance steps no matter how hard we try.

Gentlemen, have you ever had a time when you were standing on the dance floor with a deer in the headlights look swearing that your teacher never once covered the dance move just cued? Have no fear, because your partner is here to save the day. While the man leads most of the time, this is when it is necessary to abdicate this leading role to your very capable partner.

Ladies, when the time arises, be prepared to become the leader. While you might want to strong arm your man into making the right moves, remember our lesson from above – a good leader leads with his (or her) frame, not muscles. Even a small whisper to remind your partner which way to face or which foot to

use can be acceptable to get your partner back on track, just try not to make a habit of it.

Of course, this is just a guide for dancers and is no way meant to disrupt your dancing relationship with your partner. If, in your partnership, the female is more comfortable leading, then continue in this fashion. Just remember what makes a strong leader, and what makes a good follower.

Plaid Fabrics

When selecting plaids for dancing look for wide stripes, with strong contrasting colors. A small plaid in shades of blue will look like a soft blue blur when seen across the dance floor. Drape the fabric across the end of a display shelf and walk away 20 feet. You will get a different impression of the design when you turn around. Plaid fabrics make beautiful dress and shirts when chosen carefully.

All plaids are made up of repeats, lengthwise and crosswise stripes creating four sided areas. There are two basic types of plaids.

Even plaids - The stripe design is the same on both sides of the most noticeable lengthwise and crosswise stripes.

Uneven plaids - The arrangement of stripes is different on each side of the most noticeable lengthwise and crosswise stripes - in number, size and/or color of stripes.

Find one main stripe lengthwise. Look at the stripes that are next to it on each side. Then find a main crosswise stripe and look at the stripes are next to it on each side. If the arrangements of secondary stripes are the same on each side it is an even plaid. If different it is an uneven plaid. Some plaids are even in one direction but not in the other. Uneven plaids are more difficult to match when cutting and sewing.

When selecting a fabric, check to see whether the plaid is woven into the fabric or printed on the surface. If it is a printed plaid, the stripes will not be on the true grain of the fabric. Trying to make the stripes match will result in twisted grain lines. Straighten printed plaids by cutting along one thread and disregarding the print. When using a printed plaid cut the fabric according to the grain lines and try to line up the plaid print as much as you can but don't force it. A woven plaid will look the same on both sides. Determine the right side by looking at the salvage edges. When the little pin holes are pointing up it is the right side. Either side can be used as the preferred side as long as the same side is used throughout the garment. Straighten woven plaids by cutting along one stripe.

The best styles for plaid garments are simple, without a lot of seams, darts or gathers. Many patterns are marked "Not suitable for plaids or one way designs." Let the plaid be the focal point rather than intricate stitching. Consider making

the collar cuffs or yoke from a solid color fabric. Panel skirts can be cut with the pieces on the bias, but they must be cut very carefully making sure that they are all exactly the same.

The best way to cut plaids is in one layer. Trying to keep two layers of fabric exactly aligned is very difficult. It is easier to cut each pattern piece twice. Cut the first side with the pattern right side up. Then flip the pattern over and cut right side down. To position the pattern pieces look at the notches, they are the most important matching points of the pattern. Make sure each notch is in exactly the same place on the plaid as the corresponding notch on the piece it will be sewn to.

The most important places to match are the crosswise stripes at the center front and center back seams. Then match the side seam notches. Match set in sleeves front arm hole notch to the garment front armhole notch. Plaids will not match above the notches at armholes, above the bust darts at side seams, in eased or gathered areas and above the bust on princess seamed garments. Do not place a main stripe across the fullest part of the bust, abdomen or hip.

After the fabric has been cut to a perfect match it must be sewn exactly. Most plaids can be pin based together, use lots of pins and constantly check to ensure the exact same position on the front and back. Hand basting may be necessary for some plaids. Special walking feet are available to keep the two layers even. Always use the exact seam allowance indicated on the pattern. Plaids require a little more planning and care when cutting and stitching but the results are well worth the effort. This is not a project to be rushed. Work slowly and have fun creating a unique garment.






