We gained two new clubs this year: Clam Diggers of the Sou'Wester Council and the Maple Valley Plus of the Rainier Council. We have lost four clubs and one council in the federation this year. The following clubs did not renew: Boots and Laces of the Central Puget Sound Council, Buzzin' Bees of the Evergreen Council, Forks Hoh Downers of the North Olympic Council, and the Peninsula Callers and Cuers of the Peninsula Council. Also, the Central Puget Sound Council has folded. That leaves us with 77 clubs and 10 councils. We have 1,897 members as of August 31, 2024, a loss of 16 members from last year.

CALLER TO CALLER BOB AND CLAUDIA AMSBURY

Tenjoy calling, as I said in my first article; teaching is Imy passion. I love to teach and watch new dancers learn our activity and smile and have fun in the process.

This article is on teaching square dancing. Teaching can be One Night Stands, the Community Dance Program, SSD, Basic, Mainstream, Plus, and the upper levels. It could be one night a week or more nights a week. It could even be several callers teaching the same new students.

After a caller has taught new dancers for several years, as I have often said at multiple Leadership Seminars, that each new student should have to wear a badge for one year that says who taught them to square dance. I do realize that some classes have more than one caller for classes. I strongly believe that each caller would be a BETTER TEACHER. When I taught Ron and Georgine Woolcock to square dance, (several moons ago) after lessons they bought several badges for class members that said "Bob Amsbury taught me to Square Dance." I know that they wore them to many square dances.

I have three CALLERLAB hyperlinks below that you can control/click on to provide information as to teaching square dancing. There is so much teaching material available out there. I encourage each one of you to read my articles in the coming months. Please take the time to look at these sites. Even if you know it all, I promise you'll learn something new.

dancer under the search bar. Scroll down and look for teaching headings for follow up information.

I think any caller that teaches new dancers, regardless of how many classes you have taught or how long you have been teaching, you need to review your teaching skills. Albert Einstein says "Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again, expecting a different result."

Over the years I have gathered some ideas that I use as my personal criteria for teaching a new class.

- 1. Foundation and Basics: Ensure that students have a solid grasp of the basic calls and movements. Reinforce fundamentals regularly.
- 2. Progress and Pacing: Introduce new calls gradually, ensuring that students comfortable with each before moving on. Adjust the pacing based on the class's skill level.
- 3. Clear Communications: Use clear and concise language when explaining calls. Demonstrate The calls and have students practice with and without music.
- 4. Repetition and Variation: Repetition helps with retention, but vary your sequences to help keep the class engaged and challenged.
- 5. Encourage Teamwork: emphasize the importance of working together as a team. Encourage Students to help one another and communicate after the dance tip.
- 6. Use of Music: Incorporate a variety of music that aligns with the calls being taught if possible. This keeps the class dynamics up and helps students learn to listen to the rhythm and tempo.
- 7. Feedback and Encouragement: Provide positive reinforcement and constructive feedback. Celebrate some victories to build confidence.
- 8. Adaptability: Be prepared to adjust your

- teaching method or style, if a particular approach isn't resonating with the class. Every group is different.
- 9. Creating a Positive Environment: Foster a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere. Ensure that everyone feels comfortable participating regardless of skill level.
- 10. End with a Review: Summarize what you taught at the end of each class and give students a preview of what to expect in the next session,

By focusing on these points, you can create a more effective and enjoyable learning experience for y our students.

Be careful not to overwhelm or overload the new dancers. Be aware of those who are struggling and be flexible. Pretend that each new dancer has no prior knowledge of the activity (most don't). Teachers should be aware that while some students will remember what was taught from week to week, not all students will retain what was taught last week. When we add the fact that students will miss class, or stay home because one or the other was sick, or that they were just late for class, the importance of review cannot be over emphasized. It could be one or

more tips. There is always the night when there is a full moon, and nobody learns anything or remembers what they were taught that night. That's a good time to have a FUN night, calling what they already know. Learning is an upward curve; we build on calls from week to week.

I look forward to writing these monthly articles and will continue on the same topic (teaching) for a couple of months to come. I do believe that we can all be better teachers than we are today. My goal is to have every Square Dance Teacher (That's You) improve your teaching skills because of something you read this year in Footnotes. Rickrack Returns

You're thinking, 'Rickrack, how old fashioned and boring." It is 'Retro-cool' right now.

Rickrack is available online in many sizes and colors and is less expensive in bulk. The cotton rickrack in that old sewing box won't match the new stuff. The new rickrack is polyester and doesn't shrink.

One reason to consider rickrack is the same as the ladies who wore flour sack dresses - durability. We want to look pretty and fancy when we walk into the hall, but the fast-paced dancing usually leaves our blouses needing washing. Our skirts are subject to seatbelt crushing and potluck spills. Rickrack can handle this easily and not get snagged and bedraggled like laces.

The major problem with sewing on rickrack is that it tends to pucker and curl up at the tips. This is because stitchers see anything long and skinny and have to pull on it to get it 'nice and tight.' This causes the points to fold up.

Another problem is that the rickrack is thicker and stiffer than the fabric it is attached to, so the feed dogs pull it faster than the rickrack. Causing the fabric to gather under the trim.

One method is to use a kids' school glue stick on the back of the rickrack, position it gently, loosely on the fabric, and iron it in place. No, the glue won't hurt your machine. The glue stick trick makes curves and loops easy.

The best way to sew on rickrack is to use invisible thread. Wind your bobbin only half full of invisible thread. If you try to wind it all the way full, it will break the bobbin. (Voice of Experience) This thread is so fine you will have plenty on a half-full bobbin. Decrease the upper thread tension. Yes, that sounds backward.

This thread stretches, and it creates its own tension. I set my tension on '1'. If you get loops on the back of the stitching, rethread the machine, ensuring the thread is in the tension disks. It is very easy to misread this difficult-to-see stuff. If loops are still forming, increase the tension just slightly.

Consider layering rickrack. A row of baby size down the center of the jumbo size will make a unique combination. Rickrack can be twisted together for a new look. There are many ideas on the internet. Pintrest has dozens of flowers and embroidery combined with rickrack tutorials.

Plain or dressed up, Rickrack has a lot going for it. This traditional trim will look good for the life of the garment. It adds depth to the garment surface. Add rickrack to an old skirt to completely change the piece's look. Don't turn your nose up at this flexible, easy-towork trim that can add color to your creation.
